ABOUT THE LOCATION

The summer school will take place in Ethno village Cardaci, municipality Vitez, in the central part of Bosnia and Herzegovina. This sustainable complex is built entirely of natural materials and is located next to the mini hydro power (MHP) plant. It uses biomass, geothermal and solar energy. There is also a model of wind power plant. The entire facility is being heated on water pumped (by the newest technology) from nearby wells three meters deep in the ground. The Village is a great example how renewable energy can enable sustainable development of the local community.
